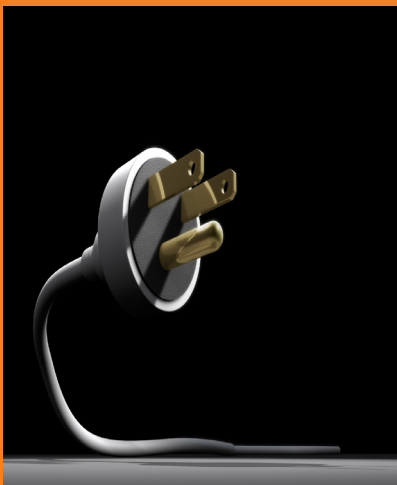

The OH&S Acts states that if you are an employer, self employed person, an employee, a customer engaging a trade person, or for that matter, any person lending a portable appliance to another person, then you have a "Duty of Care" under common law and the OH&S act to ensure that the equipment/appliance is safe.

This extends to any equipment/appliances brought into the work place by an employee, for example, an electric drill, toaster, or even a jaffle maker to use during a meal break.

If the equipment/appliance is not safe and causes an accident, both the employer and the person who provided the equipment/appliance may be liable.
